

T.V. Mediums Are 100% Fake

Mediums on T.V. are 100% fake. The medium on Paranormal State is a fraud. The kids on Physic Kids are coached. True mediums do exist, but they are very rare. They normally do not seek the limelight. To them, their gift is a curse.

You should only work with a person claiming to be a medium after you have tested their abilities. The Ghost Engineers have designed a test procedure that is fail-safe. The test basically puts on the medium a pair of noise canceling headphones and a pair of goggles that are impossible to see through. The subject can go nowhere without you leading them and they are never to remove their goggles or headphones except when they need to use a toilet, or go to sleep, (first you make sure there is nothing in their room that they can use to figure out where they are. No phone, no television, and windows that only show a parking lot or big buildings.)

Then you test the subject medium by taking them to both haunted locations and non-haunted locations. You do this at least seven times. Each time the subject “gets it right” they move up a level. For example if you are in the Waverly hills sanitarium and you tell them you are at a hotel checking in, watch their reactions. Take them to different places in the building telling them you are trying to find their room. You do this by whispering into their ear after removing one side of the headset.

Your goal is to make them think they are someplace that they are not. If they are a true medium, they should be able to tell you that the place is not a hotel, but rather a place where many people died. If they do this, the move up a level. You do this at seven different locations. You must also make sure the medium does not know which state or city they are in. If you tell them you are going to Kentucky, then they immediately try to recall all the haunted locations they read about on the Internet in Kentucky and the test becomes invalid.

If the medium is able to correctly identify parts of the location and its history and spirits then they pass. If they give you no reaction then they fail. If you take them to your home which you know is not haunted, tell them you are going to a haunted location with many ghosts. When they arrive at your house and after some time tell you they are not picking anything up, then they pass. Smart so called mediums will try to figure out ways to outsmart the test, like telling you that your home is built on what was once an ancient Indian burial ground hoping that you don't know any better. You must know the history of the location as far back as possible. If you know for a fact that no Indians were associated with that location and nothing in there is nothing in the historical records, then the medium telling you about Indian ghosts fails the that particular test.

You do this at seven different locations. If the medium correctly identifies all seven locations even after you have made certain that there is no way for them to know where they are, Plus you have deliberately mislead them about the location, then at that time they can be classified as a true medium. If they fail any part of the of the seven step test then they are not a true medium, at least not one that you can take 100% serious. But the medium, who passes all seven tests, is are rare find and you now know that they do have genuine abilities.
